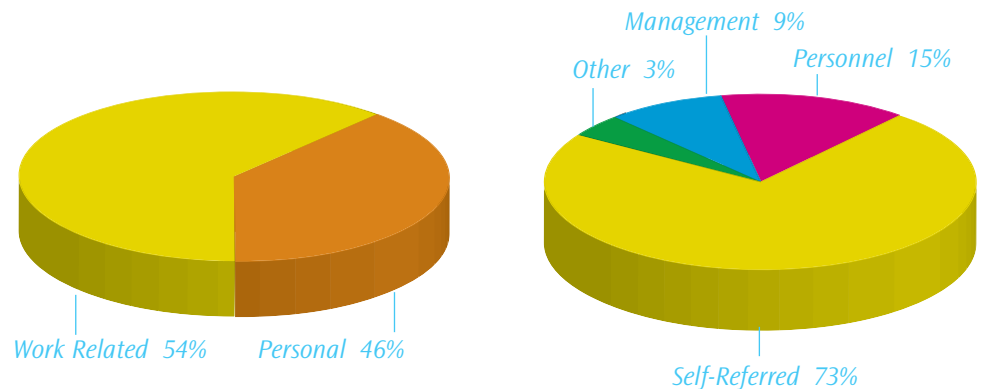

In 2006, 7,410 contacts were made with the CSEAS. Of this number, 3,206 people sought assistance with either work-related or personal issues. A total of 4,204 information queries were dealt with by the CSEAS in 2006.

CSEAS 2006

The Employee Assistance Service (EAS) is a staff resource available to all serving and retired staff.

In 2006 EAOs continued their work of providing one-to-one confidential support to clients and also supported initiatives on health promotion by arranging and/or delivering talks on relevant topics in their individual government departments.

Within the Civil Service, the overall usage and the range of presenting problems has been consistent over recent years and it is generally recognised that service provision has resulted in a comprehensive well-developed service for staff. However, there are still areas where the value of the EAS needs to be explained and highlighted so that all staff can have an awareness of the scope of the service and what it can provide to them. Consequently, it is considered important to heighten awareness of the service among all civil servants, even those who have never approached an Employee Assistance Officer.

Research into Employee Assistance provision consistently endorses its value. Part of our strategy of raising the profile of the service involved obtaining feedback from users of the service. New leaflets on *Employee Assistance Service*, *Effective Communication* and *Working on Stress* were produced and are available on the website www.cseas.gov.ie. EAOs also participated in Civil Service Training and Development Centre run courses by giving input to both *Management Training* and *Pre-retirement* courses.

Research was completed and work continues on the Civil Service Alcoholism Policy which was published in 1984 with a view to instigating an up-dated

approach to alcohol and drugs problems in the workplace.

The range of qualifications and experience of EAOs now equals or exceeds those available outside the workplace due to commitment to personal development and training. Skills are improved and the overall service enhanced by attendance at a diverse range of training courses.

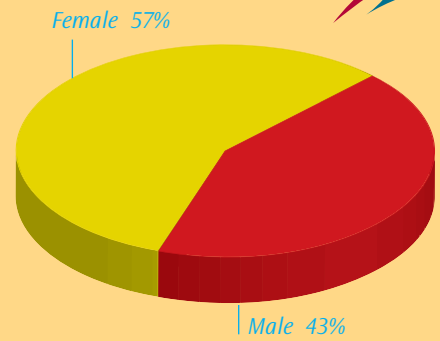

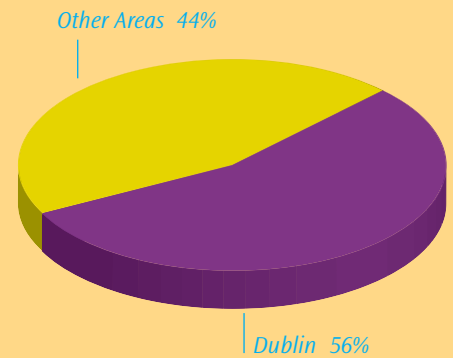

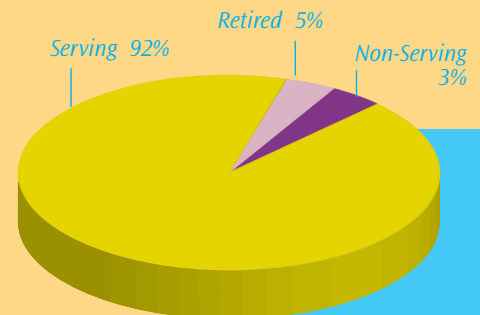

Location

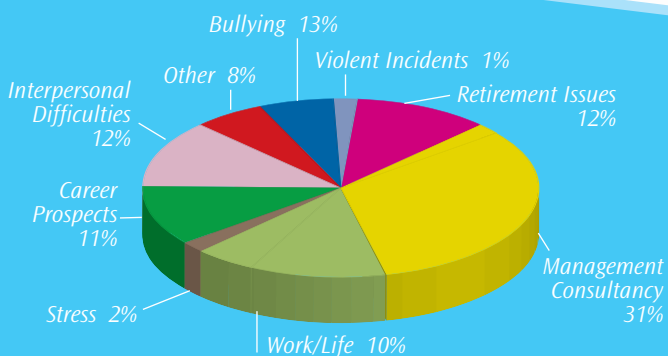

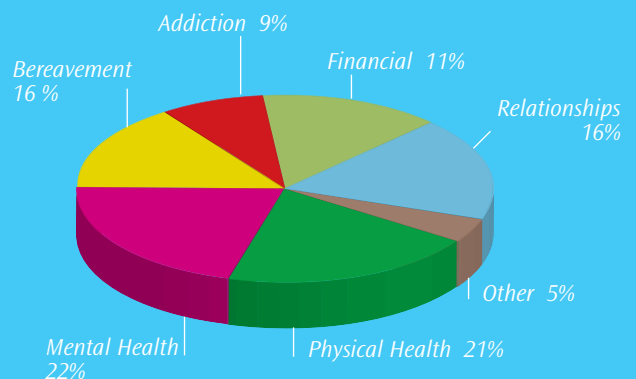

The CSEAS provides a quality resource and support service for all staff which positively affects both individual health and well-being, and organisational effectiveness.

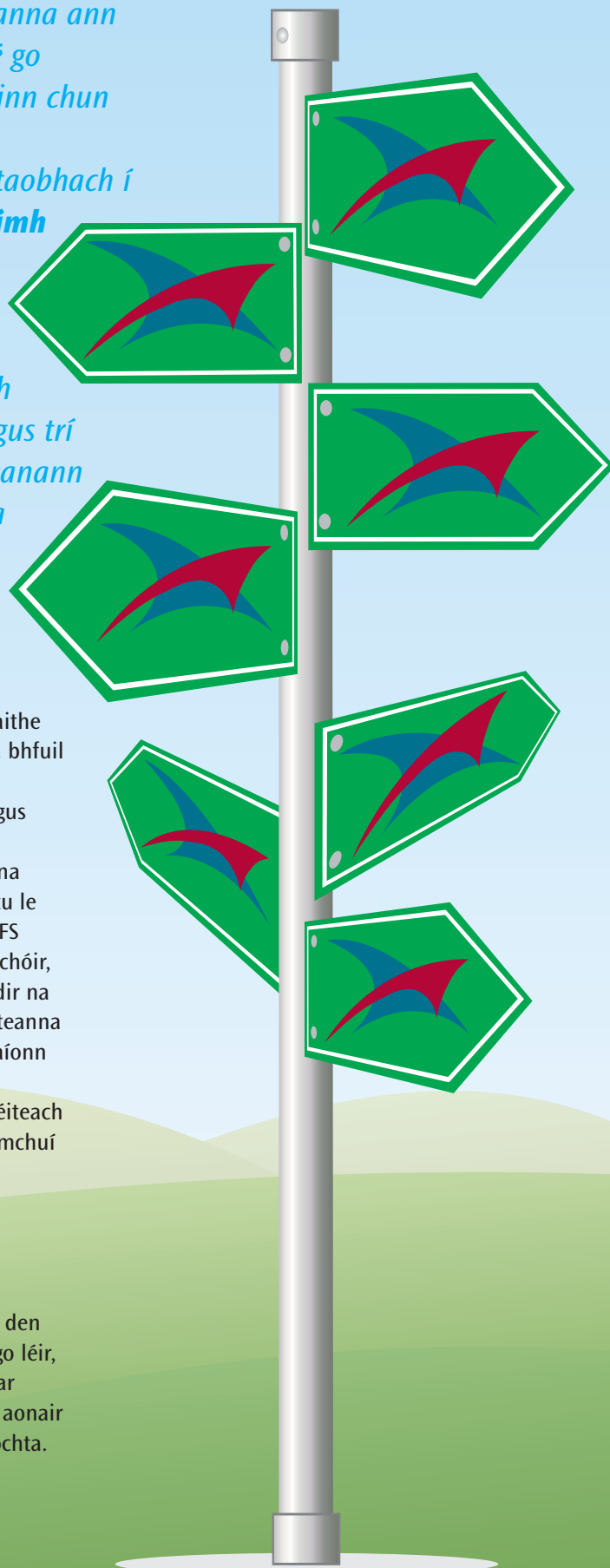

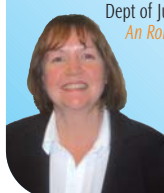

Is acmhainn foirne í an tSeirbhís Chúnaimh d'Fhostaithe (SCF) atá ar fáil don lucht foirne uile atá i mbun seirbhíse agus ar scor.

Sa bhliain 2006 lean na hOifigigh Chúnaimh d'Fhostaithe dá gcuid oibre ag soláthar tacaíochta tostaobhaí duine le duine do chliant agus thacaigh siad chomh maith le tionscnaimh a bhain le cur chun cinn sláinte trí chainteanna ar ábhair ábhartha a eagrú agus/nó a thabhairt ina ranna rialtais éagsúla.

Laistigh den Státseirbhís tá an úsáid a bhaintear as an tseirbhís agus raon na bhfadhbanna a nochtar comhsheasmhach le blianta beaga aniar agus glactar leis go ginearálta go bhfuil seirbhís chuimsitheach atá forbartha go maith ar fáil do lucht foirne de thoradh na seirbhíse.

Tá áiteanna ann i gcónaí, áfach, nach mór luach na SCF a aibhsiú agus a mhíniú iontu ionas go dtuigfidh gach ball foirne raon na seirbhíse atá á soláthar agus a bhfuil ar a cumas a chur ar fáil. Meastar ar an ábhar sin go bhfuil sé tábhachtach cur le heolas stáitseirbhíseach i gcoitinne ar an tseirbhís, fiú ina gcás siúd nár bhac ariamh le hoifigeach cúraim d'fhostaithe.

Tacaíonn taighde ar sholáthar Chúnaimh d'Fhostaithe lena fhiúntas i gcónaí. Ar chuid den straitéis a bhain le tábhacht na seirbhíse bhí bailiú aiseolais ó dhaoine a bhain feidhm as an tseirbhís. Cuireadh bileoga nua ar Employee Assistance Service, Effective Communication agus

Working on Stress ar fáil agus tá teacht orthu ar shuíomh gréasáin cseas.gov.ie. Bhí OCF páirteach freisin i gcúrsaí a chuir Lárionad Oiliúna agus Forbartha na Státseirbhíse ar siúl trí ábhar a sholáthar do chúrsaí ar Management Training agus Pre-Retirement.

Críochnaíodh taighde agus táthar ag gluaiseacht ar aghaidh leis an obair i gcás Pholasáí Alcólachta na Státseirbhíse a foilsíodh in 1984 d'fhonn cur chuige nua-

aoiseach i dtaca le fadhbanna alcóil agus drugaí a thabhairt i gcrích san ionad oibre.

De thoradh dúthrachta maidir le féinforbairt agus oiliúint tá raon na gcáilíochtaí agus na taithe atá ag OCF anois ar chomhchéim le nó níos fearr ná mar atá ar fáil lasmuigh den ionad oibre. Tá feabhas tagtha ar scileanna agus tá curtha leis an tseirbhís fhoriomlán trí fhreastal ar iliomad cineál cúrsaí.

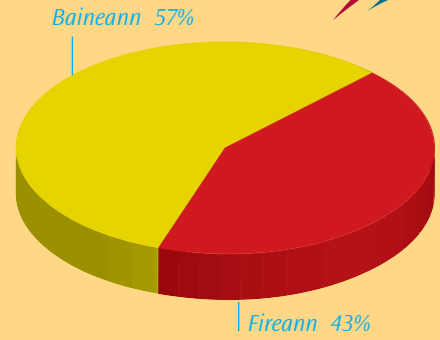
